General Facility Information

The Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre is located in Belleville, Ontario and is owned by the City of Belleville. With a population of 49,000 the Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre is well positioned to help meet the diverse health, wellness and sports needs of the community and Quinte region.

The Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre expanded the facility and opened to the public on August 20, 2012 with the support of significant infrastructure investment by the Federal, Provincial and local Governments. The newly expanded Centre is now more than 330,000 square feet and features:

- 3 NHL sized ice pads (Family Dental Centre Arena, Rink B, Wally Dever)
- 3200 large seating Olympic sized arena (Yardmen Arena)
- Templeman Menninga Aquatic Centre with an 8 lane, 25 metre competition pool, preschool pool and therapy pool
- 50+ Centre for Older Adults Senior's Centre
- Multi-use Gymnasium that can transform into an event venue for up to 400 people
- Fitness Studios (workout, aerobics, yoga)
- Family Dental Centre Indoor Track - 3 lane rubberized walking/running track
- Youth Drop in Centre
- Public Lounge
- Preschool Room
- Community group rental space
- Meeting rooms, including Fireplace and Multipurpose Room
- Retail space, including a Café style food provider, physiotherapy and massage services and a pro-shop

The City of Belleville's objective is to provide corporations, businesses, groups, organizations and individuals with an opportunity to own the naming rights to a specific asset/facility within the Centre for a defined period of time. This arrangement will provide an abundance of exposure opportunities to any successful naming rights holder, increase the City's partnerships and provide much needed revenues to help keep costs down for programs and services within the Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre, ultimately benefitting the entire community.

Benefits Included

Our Naming Rights Partner will realize significant exposure opportunities and increased profile within the Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre, the City of Belleville and the Quinte region as a whole. In addition to year round exposure in the facility, brand recognition as a community supporter and brand association as a company/organization/individual enriching the quality of life in Belleville is certain. The list below outlines the benefits that will be made available to our Naming Rights Sponsor. A more comprehensive and detailed listing of benefits are available and will be developed in conjunction with the Naming Rights Sponsor as part of negotiations.

- Facility signage erected in a prominent location in the named facility/asset (costs associated with signage are covered by the Naming Rights Sponsor)
- Name identification attached to the naming asset in all facility contracts, internal way finding and in all official City of Belleville references/publications: including the Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre website, event advertising, media/press releases, community culture & recreation playbook, flyers and promotional materials. For Arena B and the Gymnasium there is an added opportunity to be profiled on the outdoor marquee tri-board vision sign – subject to additional naming fees (average daily traffic count is 22,000 conducted in November 2014)
- The City of Belleville will make every effort to ensure that outside groups and organizations using the facility/asset use the agreed upon Name in external promotions



Naming Rights Fees (Minimum \$ Values)

Generally speaking naming rights agreements are entered into for a five or ten year term (subject to negotiations). The minimum values outlined below can be used as a guideline for interested parties and include the standard benefits outlined in this handout. Opportunities such as the tri-vision sign, advertising on rink boards or other value added items are considered above and beyond the minimum values identified below and are subject to negotiation and additional naming rights fees.

Activities and Events Hosted at the Centre

It is estimated that more than 30,000 people visits per week are made to the Centre during the peak season (September to April) with well over 1 million people visits made to the Centre each year (Includes multiple visits made by the same person). These numbers continue to grow.



Home to Regular User

Groups: The Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre is home to a number of regular user groups including: Belleville Minor Hockey Association, Belleville Girls Minor Hockey Association, Belleville Youth Swim Team, Quinte Blades Speed Skating Club, Belleville Minor Ball Hockey, Quinte Figure Skating, Quinte Regional Minor Hockey, Adult Hockey Leagues and private rentals.

City Recreation Programs and Services:

The City of Belleville's Recreation, Culture & Community Services Department provides regular recreational programming throughout the year. Pre-paid programs or pay as you go and multi-passes are available. The following is an overview from 2015:

- There were 4,985 new Wellness Passports, 1,674 renewals processed and 3,987 visitor passes given out. At the end of 2015, there are now more than 20,000 active passports
- There were 10,947 registered participants for programs (includes 3,696 registered in aquatic programs)
- 2,383 swimmers took swimming lessons, 1,950 swimmers attended swim meets and pool was open 97 hours per week
- 60 hours each week of sports/active programming in the gymnasium for all ages toddlers to seniors (1/2 in summer months)
- 70 weekly health and wellness classes (1/2 in summer months). 12,000 drop-in visitors in the workout studio
- 1,629 spaces were filled in the summer with children and youth ages 3 to 16 participating in summer camp programs
- 11,337 bookings with more than 100 special events
- 117,527 visits were made to the website





Special Events:

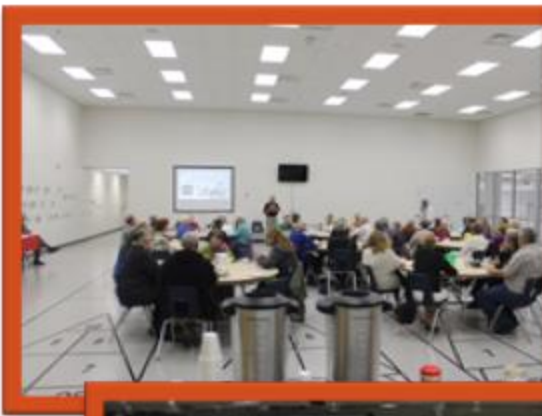
