CITY OF BELLEVILLE RECREATIONAL SKATING PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

AS PER THE ONTARIO RECREATION FACILITIES ASSOCIATION, THE FOLLOWING MUST BE FOLLOWED WHEN PARTICIPATING IN THESE PROGRAMS.

The City of Belleville and the Quinte Sports and Wellness Centre are committed to providing safe and enjoyable recreational experiences for all. Our goal is to provide a variety of high quality activities and programs that are inclusive, and where all people have equal opportunity to participate regardless of age, ability, or income.

Mobility assistive devices are permitted on the ice and should use the perimeter of the ice (near the boards). Wheels must be cleaned to remove any sand or salt. Occupants should wear a CSA approved helmet and be accompanied by a skater, wearing only skates, over the age of 16. For the most positive experience, we recommend attending a "Family or Adult Skates" where the maximum numbers are capped at 50 participants. FAMILY SKATES:

This is a drop-in recreational skating program for those who wish to practice their skating skills on a less busy ice surface. All skaters must follow the "Public Skating Code of Conduct".

(Maximum of 50 skaters will be permitted)

- → CSA Approved helmets are MANDATORY for all family skate participants
- → CSA Approved Skate aids will be permitted

ADULT PUBLIC SKATES:

This is a drop-in leisure skating program for adults (16+). This program is not suitable for those who wish to figure skate or speed skate. All skaters must follow the "Public Skating Code of Conduct".

→ CSA Approved Skate aids will be permitted

PUBLIC SKATES:

This is a drop-in recreational skating program. Skating Aids cannot be permitted during these times due to safety issues. Ice Monitor staff will be present and rules must be obeyed. (Maximum of 100 skaters will be permitted)

Public Skating Code of Conduct:

All patrons who participate in public skates must respect the following rules:

- → The use of CSA approved helmets are strongly recommended
- → Children under 10 years must be supervised by a guardian over 16 years of age
- → All participants are required to wear skates on the ice no other footwear is permitted
- → No food or drink permitted on the ice
- → Skate in the same direction as the other skaters (no weaving in & out of other skaters)
- → All skaters are to conduct themselves appropriately at all times
- → No horseplay/games/tag, etc.
- → No unruly behaviour or profanity
- → No skating backwards
- → No figure skating manoeuvres
- → No erratic/excessive speed skating
- → No balls, pucks, chairs, pylons, strollers, Toboggans, hockey sticks, or any other item that might interfere with the safety of another skater are to be used while skating
- → No headsets, cell phones or hand held electronic devices are to be used while skating
- → No carrying of children is permitted
- → No sitting or climbing over boards
- → Report all accidents/injuries to skate patrol staff
- → Please respect, listen to, and follow instructions from the skate patrol staff at all times

ADULT (16+) & SENIOR (50+) SHINNY HOCKEY:

This is a drop-in program for those who wish to participate in shinny hockey. ALL players must sign-in at the Customer Service Desk. Please bring a light and dark coloured jersey.

Adult & Senior Shinny Code of Conduct:

- → CSA approved helmets are MANDATORY
- → Full hockey equipment is recommended
- → All levels of hockey are welcome in this recreational program
- → Body checking is not permitted
- → Lifting or slap shots are not permitted
- → Respect fellow players
- → Fair and even shift play is required

FAMILY & YOUTH SHINNY HOCKEY:

This is an inclusive drop-in program for those who wish to participate in shinny hockey. All participants must wear their coloured band (to receive upon payment). Please bring a light and dark coloured jersey.

Family & Youth Shinny Code of Conduct:

- → CSA approved helmets and full hockey gear is MANDATORY
- → All levels of hockey are welcome in this recreational, non-competitive program
- → More experienced players are expected to treat all participants in a positive manner
- → Body checking is forbidden
- → Lifting or slap shots are not permitted
- → Avoid aggressive play
- → Passing to teammates is required sharing the puck will be enforced
- → Respect fellow players
- → Shifts will be monitored by the staff person to ensure fair and equal playing time for all
- → Everyone must listen to the instructions of the on-ice staff person

FIGURE SKATING PRACTICE

For registered, insured FIGURE SKATERS and their COACHES, we offer a practice session. Coaches must be with their skaters to ensure safety on the ice.

Figure Skating Code of Conduct

- → Maximum 15 skaters on the ice
- → Coaches must cooperate with routines and music

→ No lifts, throws, or jumps should be performed during this practice time

Schedules (for all of these programs):

Pre-registration is required for all recreational skates. Upon arrival, clients need to check in at the customer service desk and get their wrist band, which must be worn for the duration of the skate.

These include, but are not limited to: a) injuries from collisions or contact with other individuals on the ice surface, b) injuries from falls, and c) injuries from pucks, sticks, and other hockey equipment that may cause injury during routine activities to the sport.
